Wash and care

Follow guidance from Clean Cloth Nappies:



Store

- Rinse away soiling/poo
- · No need to rinse nappies with only wee
- Place in open basket with good air flow until you're ready to wash them

Wash twice

- First wash: 30-70min cycle (40-60°C), only nappies used that day
- Second wash: 2.5–3hr cycle at 40–60°C with nappies plus kids' clothes and small items
- · Can wait up to 3 days before second wash

Dry

- Outside on clothes line or inside on airer/rack
- May use dryer for absorbent inserts only (not covers)

Why choose cloth nappies?

Reduce waste

- Did you know a child uses approximately 6,000 disposable nappies before they are toilet trained?
- With an average of 1,400 babies born each year to families living in Whitehorse that equals 2.8 million nappies per year
- Disposable nappies take up to 150 years to break down
- Every disposable nappy ever used is still on our planet

Save money

- Disposable nappies cost around \$3,000 per child
- Cloth nappies cost \$250-\$800 for a complete set
- Save approximately \$2,000+ per child
- Reuse the same nappies for subsequent children for even greater savings

Do it your way

There is no "right" way to cloth nappy. Use them:

- Full-time or part-time
- Only during the day
- Try reusable wipes, swim nappies or wet bags

Have fun with nappy changes

Modern cloth nappies are:

- Easy to use and wash
- Available in fun colours and prints
- Adjustable in size as your baby grows
- A chance to make a statement with limited edition prints, sports themes, or artistic designs

How many do you need?

- Newborns: ~12 per day (36 nappies for washing every 2 days)
- Older babies/toddlers: ~6 per day (24-30 nappies for washing every 2-3 days)
- Night use: 6 dedicated night nappies

Cloth nappy styles



Pocket nappies

- Stay-dry layer and waterproof cover sewn together forming a pocket
- Absorbent fabric insert placed inside the pocket
- Easy to use and similar to disposables

All-in-ones

- All components sewn together
- Simple to use with no assembly required
- Not recommended for dryer use





All-in-twos

- Stay-dry layer sewn to absorbent insert
- Insert attaches to waterproof cover with press studs
- Parts separate for easier drying

Hybrids

- Combines multiple styles or reusable/disposable parts
- Great for camping or flexibility
- Example: reusable cover with disposable insert





Flats

- Traditional terry-towelling squares
- Fold, wrap around baby, secure with fastener
- Requires waterproof cover and fastener
- Very affordable and quick-drying

Preflats and prefolds

- Preflats: Like flats but with waist tabs
- **Prefolds**: Rectangle with extra absorbency in center
- Affordable newborn solution







Fitteds

- "Shaped" nappy made entirely of absorbent fabric
- No folding needed
- Requires waterproof cover
- Excellent for overnight use
