Dear Resident or Business Owner/Operator,

Weekly Works Alert – week commencing 5 September 2022

We're removing the dangerous and congested level crossings at Union Road, Surrey Hills and Mont Albert Road, Mont Albert by lowering the rail line beneath the roads in an open trench and building a new premium station with better facilities and more services.

Works taking place from 5 September:

Traffic management and detours will be in place on Union Road, Mont Albert Road and local streets to assist with vehicle and pedestrian movements. Pedestrian access will be maintained around our sites.

Union Road					
Traffic management	Continuing until 25 September	 Sunbury Crescent will be under traffic management between the Coles Local car park entry and Union Road. Access to the Coles Local basement carpark is available via Union Road. Brief closures will be required for up to 1 hour, access will be via the laneway off Croydon Road during these periods. Please follow the directions of traffic control. 			
Pedestrian access changes	Commencing Tuesday 27 September	 From Tuesday 27 September, there will be a temporary closure of the ground level pedestrian crossing on the west side of Union Road for up to four weeks. Pedestrian access across the rail corridor will be maintained via the Union Road underpass. Note that the demolition of the underpass (included in previous notices) has been postponed so that pedestrian access can be maintained on one side of Union Road. The underpass will now be permanently closed and demolished to make way for new infrastructure later in 2022. 			
Gas relocation works	Monday 12 September	 Gas relocation works will take place in the shoulder lane of Union Road at the corner of Stirling Crescent and at the corner of Sunbury Crescent for up to two weeks from Monday 12 September. Traffic management will be in place and two-way traffic will be maintained on Union Road. Parking will not be impacted by this work.

Service Relocations - Road closure	Until Tuesday 6 September	 Due to unexpected conditions and wet weather, the full closure of Mont Albert Road has been extended. Mont Albert Road will now be closed in both directions at the level crossing day and night until early evening (around 6pm) on Tuesday 6 September. Works will take place day and night during this time. We will continue to make every effort to open the eastbound lane

Service Relocations - Lane closure	From Tuesday 6 September until Friday 23 September	 as soon as possible and apologise for any inconvenience. The westbound lane of Mont Albert Road will be closed day and night between Leopold Crescent and Gordon Street until Friday 23 September. Works will take place day and night during this time.
Pedestrian access changes	Commencing Monday 29 August until Friday 23 September	 Pedestrian crossings on both sides of Mont Albert Road will be closed while this work is undertaken. Pedestrian access will be maintained via the Mont Albert Station underpass.
Cable pulling	Wednesday 21 September for up to two nights	 Service provider NBN and their contractors will undertake cable pulling on Mont Albert Road at night on Wednesday 21 September. Work will take place at up to three locations, including: Mont Albert Road near Gordon Street; Mont Albert Road near the corner of Lorne Parade; and Mont Albert Road near the corner of Leopold Crescent.

Capping beam works	Wednesday 7 September until November 2022	 Capping beam installation works will commence on 7 September and continue until late November. A capping beam is a concrete beam that connects onto the concrete piles. Drive way access and one way traffic will be maintained in the westbound direction throughout capping beam works. A temporary eastbound lane closure will be in place between Box Place and Mont Albert Station until late November.
		 Large machinery may need be moved to and from the site to enable this work, involving movement of oversized trucks and loading or unloading of equipment.
Installation of groundwater monitoring wells	Week commencing 12 September	 Work will take place at the corner of Churchill Street and Stanhope Street and on Churchill Street between Stanhope Street and Hamilton Street for up to three days. Work will include service investigation and installation of groundwater monitoring wells. Up to six parking spaces will be required on Churchill Street between Hamilton Street and Stanhope Street for up to three days while this work is undertaken.

Hard stand construction	Commencing 5 September until 13 September	 Construction of foundations to support piling machinery will commence on Beresford Street between Mont Albert Road and 8 Beresford Street. Access to Beresford Street will be via High Street and traffic management will be in place. On-street parking between Mont Albert Road and 8 Beresford Street will be closed while these works are carried out. Drive way access will not be affected.
Piling works	Commencing 13 September until late- September	 Piling works (installing vertical concrete columns in the ground to form the walls of the trench) will commence on Beresford Street between Mont Albert Road and 8 Beresford Street. Access to Beresford Street will be via High Street and traffic management will be in place. Driveway access will not be affected.
Sewer relocation works	Commencing late- September	 Service investigation works, excavation and boring works will commence for upcoming sewer relocation works. Traffic management and a temporary closure of on-street parking and driveway access will be in place for some properties while these works are undertaken. Impacted properties will be notified separately.

		 In the early hours of the morning, large trucks will deliver the modular buildings to Windsor Crescent and a large crane will lift the buildings into the site.
Vegetation Trimming	Early October	 Over-hanging branches will need to be trimmed in early October to safely make way for the building deliveries along the delivery and bus route. Vegetation trimming is informed by an independent arborist assessment. Only minor trimming is required and the structure and health of trees will not be adversely affected.
Movement of machinery	Continuing until 2023	 Parking restrictions will remain in place on Windsor Crescent near Lorne Parade Reserve until 2023. Lane closures, parking changes and traffic management may be required at times for movement of machinery to and from site.

Piling and shaft construction	Continuing until late 2022	 Piling and stormwater drainage shaft construction will continue on Sunbury Crescent. Local vehicle access to Sunbury Crescent is available from Robinson Road until 5 September and traffic management is in place to assist. On-street parking and driveway access is closed between houses 17 and 23 Sunbury Crescent. From 5 September until 25 September, local vehicle access to properties located between 25 and 49 Sunbury Crescent will be via Union Road. Access to properties between 1 and 13 will be via Robinson Road. On-street parking and driveway access will be closed between 15 and 23 Sunbury Crescent.
Drainage works	Commencing from Tuesday 6 September until Saturday 17 September	 Trenching works will be commence on Sunbury Crescent to install drainage between properties located at 5 and 7 Sunbury Crescent. While this work is undertaken, on-street parking will be temporarily restricted between properties located at 5 and 5A Sunbury Crescent. Vehicle and pedestrian access will be maintained.
Sewer and water property connections	Commencing Monday 12 September	 From Monday 12 September, sewer connection works will be carried out for a week adjacent to 21 Sunbury Crescent. This will involve trenching and excavation works. Traffic control will be in place to assist pedestrians around the work area. From Monday 12 September, water main property connection works will be carried out. This includes excavation and trenching works for a week. Driveway access will be temporarily closed for properties 11, 13, 25 and 27 Sunbury Crescent. As work progresses, access will be opened. The water bypass will be removed once this work is completed.

Stormwater drainage	Commencing 5 September until 13 October (previously scheduled for late August)	 Works to install new stormwater drainage along Bedford Avenue will commence with service investigation works and trenching works. From 5 September for approximately four days Bedford Avenue will be closed between Union Road and Zeplins Lane. Access to Bedford Avenue (and Zeplins Lane) will be via Montrose Street and Blackburn Street during this time. Driveway access will be closed between Zeplins Lane and Union Road. From 9 September Bedford Avenue will be closed between Zeplins Lane and Blackburn Street for approximately two weeks. Access to Bedford Avenue (and Zeplins Lane) will be via Union Road duringthis time.

		 On street parking and driveway access will be closed from 9 to 22 September for 1 Blackburn Street and 5 Bedford Avenue. Traffic Management will be in place to assist with pedestrian and traffic detours.

Sewer relocation works	Continuing until October 2022	 A staged road closure will remain in place as sewer relocation works progress. Access to Stirling Crescent will be maintained via the laneway behind the Harmony Market and via Canterbury Road. Driveway access is temporarily impacted for some properties. Affected stakeholders have been contacted and alternative parking arrangements are in place. Following sewer relocation works, stormwater installation works will commence. Impacted stakeholders will be advised of any changes to access via doorknock, one-on-one meetings and SMS. 			
Watermain connection works	Thursday 15 to Saturday 17 September (night works)	 Night work will take place from Thursday 15 to Saturday 17 September between 7pm and 7am to install watermain valves at three locations along Stirling Crescent. Work will require road saw cutting, excavation and reinstatement. A short-term water outage may be associated with this work. Affected properties will be notified prior to the water outage. 			
Surrey Park					
24/7 truck access	Continuing until Monday 26 September	Trucks and machinery will be entering and exiting the Surrey Park storage site throughout September including during 24/7 works.			

Please be aware that works can sometimes take longer than expected or need to be rescheduled due to weather and other factors outside of our control. To ensure you're alerted to any changes to the timeframes in this notice, please subscribe to SMS updates by following the instructions below.

Upcoming night and weekend works

Crews will work at night time on the following dates:

- Night work will take place from Thursday 15 to Saturday 17 September between 7pm and 7am to install
 watermain valves at three locations along Stirling Crescent. Work will require road saw cutting,
 excavation and reinstatement.
- Night work will take place during road and lane closures at the Mont Albert Road level crossing until **Friday 23 September** for utility relocation works and new stormwater drainage installation.
- Track inspections work will take place in the rail corridor on **Wednesday 21 September** between 1am and 4.30am near Robinson Road and Beresford Street (north of Mont Albert Road). Work will involve the use of hand tools and an NDD truck.
- Overhead wire and track inspections and minor maintenance will take place in the rail corridor between 1am and 4.30am on Wednesday 21 September near Robinson Road and Chruchill Street near Elgar Road.
- Works will be undertaken on two Sundays in October at the intersection of Beresford, Montrose and Wilson streets and Lorne Parade Reserve for the new large watermain.


