Goal Statement

This position supports the delivery of high-quality early childhood education and care while the incumbent undertakes a nationally recognised early childhood qualification. The role works under supervision to assist qualified and trained educators in providing safe, inclusive, play-based learning environments for children. The trainee will develop practical skills and knowledge through hands on experience and structured training, contributing to positive outcomes for children and families.

About the Traineeship

The trainee will work across all age groups and children's rooms within a Whitehorse Early Learning Services (WELS) Centre. Rotations will occur in structured blocks of time to ensure continuity for children and educators and to support the trainee's development. The trainee will be supervised and supported by experienced educators and room leaders, with duties aligned to the practical components of their training program. Dedicated time and support will be provided for study related activities and mentoring will be provided to help the trainee reflect on their practice, build capability, and meet course requirements.

- Assist qualified and trained educators in implementing engaging, play-based experiences that support each child's learning and development.
- Support the care, safety and wellbeing of children during indoor and outdoor routines, meals, rest and transitions.
- Help create and maintain inclusive, nurturing and well-organised environments that promote exploration and belonging.
- Build respectful, responsive relationships with children through everyday interactions and play.
- Begin to build warm, respectful relationships with families through daily greetings and simple interactions, under supervision.
- Contribute to daily team practices, including intentional teaching, observation and reflection, under guidance.
- Follow the direction of educators and room leaders, actively participating in routines and program delivery.
- Complete training tasks and participate in study-related activities as part of the formal traineeship.
- Apply Whitehorse values and policies, including child safety, diversity and inclusion.
- Uphold confidentiality and demonstrate professionalism in all interactions with children, families and colleagues.

Physical Activities – Child Care

Working in early childhood education involves being active throughout the day. You will need to:

Moving and Lifting

- Lift and carry children (sometimes more than 10kg), often helping them into cots, chairs, and on or off change tables.
- Carry and move equipment such as toys, chairs, and play materials, usually twice a day.
- Set up and pack away toys and play mats multiple times a day, often at floor level.
- · Push or pull bins and equipment as needed.

Working at Children's Level

- · Spend time kneeling, squatting, or bending to interact with children during activities and routines.
- Sit on low chairs or on the floor for group activities, story time, or play.

Rest and Sleep Time

- Lift children into cots or place mattresses on the floor for rest time.
- · Help children settle to sleep

Toileting and Nappy Changing

- Support toddlers and young children with toileting routines.
- Change nappies using change tables designed to reduce the need for bending.

Meal and Cleaning Routines

- Help serve food, clean up spills, and wipe down tables.
- Do light cleaning tasks such as loading washing machines or folding linen.

General

- Work both indoors and outdoors in different weather conditions.
- Use basic technology to assist with communication or documentation.
