Mayor's Message Cr Andrew Davenport

I'd like to wish everyone a Happy Lunar New Year.

This is a joyous time of year for our Chinese community and we will be celebrating with them at the Whitehorse Lunar New Year Festival. Council will also be launching our presence on the social media platform WeChat this month, an exciting new way for us to connect with our Chinese community.

Whitehorse, and Melbourne more broadly, is going through a period of significant growth and change driven by State Government planning policies. Our city is home to 2 of the 6 new Suburban Rail Loop stations (Box Hill and Burwood), which will come with a substantial increase in housing development. The State Government recently released the final Visions for these precincts, which you can view at **bigbuild.vic.gov.au**.

In addition, the State Government has set ambitious targets for increased housing, as well as developing



new 'activity centres' surrounding train stations at Mitcham, Nunawading and Blackburn. These activity centres will act as a hub for more development including housing, employment and services.

All these changes have major implications for Whitehorse. If you would like to learn more, I encourage you to attend our upcoming community forum. The forum will feature a panel of independent planning experts who will explain the changes, and there will be an opportunity to ask questions. Details are in the article below.

Whitehorse community forum on State Government planning reforms

We are holding a community information forum about the State Government's proposed planning reforms. This includes the Suburban Rail Loop, housing targets, and the newly proposed activity centres around Blackburn, Nunawading and Mitcham stations. This will be an opportunity for you to pose questions to an expert panel of planning and industry professionals.





Funding success for Gardiners Creek Reserve

We have been successful in advocating for \$189,000 from the Federal Government for a revegetation project at Gardiners Creek Reserve in Box Hill South.

The project will regenerate and extend native vegetation along the creek – including enhancing a wetland adjacent to Gardiners Creek (KooyongKoot).

Woody weeds in the area will be removed and new native plants will be planted to improve ground cover and increase the extent of canopy trees.

Works are set to begin this month and be finished by late 2027. Council will provide support towards tree works and in-kind project management.

Open space is shaping Whitehorse



Did you know Whitehorse is home to 661 hectares of open space? That's equivalent to 326 Melbourne Cricket Grounds and 30 Melbourne Zoos.

We are committed to protecting and expanding our open space network of parks, reserves and gardens. These green spaces are essential for the health of our community and our environment.

You told us in last year's Shaping Whitehorse community survey that open space is important to our community. We are planning for the future of our city through our Council Plan 2025-2029, Annual Budget 2025/26 and Long-term Financial Plan.

But we are not just planning for open spaces – we are creating them! Construction of a new open space near the Gardiners Creek Trail (at Hay Street, Box Hill South) is due to begin next month. We purchased the vacant land last year and have developed the plans for the new park with community input.

We will have more updates on both Shaping Whitehorse and the Gardiners Creek Trail open space projects in the coming months.



Help us to create clean, high-quality compost by putting food scraps and garden waste in your Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO) bin.

Compost created from our FOGO bins improves soil quality across Victoria, helping grow food for our families and the community.

You can add food scraps loose, wrap them in a small amount of newspaper or paper towel, or use bright green compostable liners with the AS 4736 code.

Residents can access 2 free liner rolls per household each financial year – you can pick them up from our Civic Centre in Nunawading.
